
#### **Family Play Bag Sponsor**

### What is a StoryWalk®?

A *StoryWalk®* is an opportunity for children and families to experience reading a book while walking through a chosen area such as a park, trail or neighborhood. *StoryWalks®* promote literacy, outdoor physical activity, and encourage parent and community involvement.

Along with a parent, caregiver or educator, children follow a path from one laminated poster board to the next, each containing one page of a children's picture book. Some *StoryWalks®* include collecting items along the way, or a snack or activity related to the story. At the Parent Resource Centre, for special events, we like to add activity areas at the end of each *StoryWalk®* to



further engage children by using ideas directly from the books to influence free play.

The stories may have a common theme such as the season or location where the walk takes place - encouraging children to make connections between the text and the world around them. The boards tell a story and provide prompts for adults to guide discussions with open questions. This will make it easier for children to engage in discussions, make predications and enhance their learning.



This vibrantly illustrated children's book is a beautiful retelling of a traditional Métis story. #### A Peacock among Pigeons





A Peacock Among Pigeons is an LGBT-themed children's book that tells the tale of learning how to stand out when you can't fit in. This children's story teaches the importance of celebrating our differences and learning to love the feathers you live in.

Peter the peacock doesn't know how it happened, but he found

himself growing up in a flock of pigeons. Surrounded by a world of grey, he found himself feeling less than his peers and was embarrassed by his feathers. After he fails to blend in, he decides that it's time to learn to fly on his own. Along the way, he meets new bird friends from all different flocks that teach him a lesson he will never forget.
